RESERVATIONS & PAYMENTS:

CANCELLATIONS: All cancellations must be submitted in writing to Pleasant Holidays and are based on the departure date of the core program. The cancellation date is the date on which Pleasant Holidays receives the written notification of the intent to cancel at its place of business.

One flight bag per person is also allowed with the understanding that it is to be constantly in the care of the owner. Airline regulations require that the flight bag must fit beneath the seat and should not exceed 45 inches overall. Garment bags cannot be carried. It is the responsibility of each program participant to identify and comply with other baggage restrictions designated by the applicable airline. This may be done directly with the airline when air tickets are distributed approximately three weeks prior to the group departure date.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

JAPN 1 ELEMENTARY JAPANESE 4 UNITS

Intended for students without previous exposure to Japanese. Includes the study of essentials of pronunciation, vocabulary, idioms, and grammatical instructions along with an introduction to Japanese culture.

JAPN 2 ELEMENTARY JAPANESE 4 UNITS

Prerequisite JAPN 1. Further development of conversational, reading and writing skills in Japanese with special emphasis on verbs, grammar and extension of vocabulary. Further study of Japanese culture.

JAPN 3 INTERMEDIATE JAPANESE 4 UNITS

Prerequisite JAPN 2. Continued development of Japanese language skills and their use as tools in exploring Japanese civilization. Further study and review of grammar, exercises in word building, derivation and extension of the active and recognition vocabularies. Increased exposure to Japanese culture, such as film, music and history.

JAPN 4 INTERMEDIATE JAPANESE 4 UNITS

Prerequisite JAPN 3. Further practice in speaking and writing of Japanese. Collateral reading in Japanese. Broad exposure to culture elements of Japan such as art, music, film and history.

JAPN 5 ADVANCED JAPANESE 4 UNITS

Prerequisite JAPN 4. Further practice and development of skills toward proficiency in Japanese. Advanced exposure to Japanese culture such as art, music, film, history and literature.

JAPN 53 CONVERSATIONAL JAPANESE 3 UNITS

Prerequisite JAPN 2. Development of intermediate Japanese Conversation skills. Study in the natural language environment to immerse yourself.



ITINERARY:

DAY 1: SUNDAY, JUNE 22: DEPART LOS ANGELES TO TOKYO

Meet at Los Angeles Airport for your nonstop flight on United Airlines to Tokyo.

DAY 2: MONDAY, JUNE 23: ARRIVE TOKYO – TRANSFER TO YOUTH CENTER

Upon arrival at Tokyo's Narita Airport, this afternoon, a transfer has been arranged to take you from the airport to the National Olympics Memorial Youth Center, where both your lodging and instruction have been arranged in conjunction with Yamano Japanese School. To be sure, Tokyo is very different from Western capitals, but what really sets the city apart is its people. Approximately 12 million people reside within Tokyo's 1,288 sq. km (800 sq. miles), and almost one-fourth of Japan's total population lives within commuting distance of the city. With its high-energy, visual overload, Tokyo makes even New York seem like a sleepy, laid-back town. And yet, despite its limited space for harmonious living, Tokyo remains one of the safest cities in the world, with remarkably little crime or violence. Hardworking, honest, and helpful to strangers, the Japanese are their country's greatest asset.

DAYS 3-7: TUES - SATURDAY, JUNE 24-28: TOKYO

Language instruction will be provided each day for four hours, 10:00am-12noon, and 1:00pm-3:00pm. On Tuesday afternoon, enjoy a half-day introductory city tour of Tokyo including the Imperial Palace, Meiji Shrine and Asakusa Kannon Temple. A Tokyo and campus orientation session will also be conducted on Tuesday, led by the Yamano staff.

DAY 8: SUNDAY, JUNE 29: TOKYO AT LEISURE

A day to explore this bustling metropolis. You may also want to use your provided seven-day rail pass during this weekend for a short visit outside Tokyo, such as Kamakura.

DAYS 9-13: MONDAY - FRIDAY, JUNE 30-JULY 4: TOKYO

Language instruction will be provided each day for four hours, 10:00am-12noon, and 1:00pm-3:00pm.

A special Yamano Cultural Exchange Day is slated during the program, where the group will be able to dress up in traditional Japanese attire as shoguns and geishas.

DAYS 14 & 15: SATURDAY-SUNDAY, JULY 5-6: TOKYO AT LEISURE

Two full days for exploring in and around Tokyo.

DAYS 16-19: MONDAY - THURSDAY, JULY 7-10: TOKYO

Language instruction will be provided each day for four hours, 10:00am-12noon, and 1:00pm-3:00pm.

DAY 20: FRIDAY, JULY 11: TOKYO – KYOTO

Transfer on your own from the Youth Center to Tokyo rail station where you will use your provided rail pass to travel between Tokyo and Kyoto. Upon arrival, enjoy a half-day sightseeing tour of perhaps Japan's most picturesque city, visiting Kinkakuji Temple, Heian Jingu Shrine, and Sanjusangendo Temple. Not only is Kyoto the most historically significant town in the nation, this former capital was also the only major Japanese city spared from the bombs of World War II. As such, it's rich with temples, shrines, imperial palaces, and traditional wooden homes. Following the tour, transfer to your Kyoto hotel for a two-night stay, with breakfast included.

DAY 21: SATURDAY, JULY 12: KYOTO – NARA EXCURSION

Travel by train from the short journey from Kyoto to Nara, where a sightseeing tour will be offered of this ancient city, visiting Todaiji Temple, Kasuga Taisha Shrine and Nara Park. In 710, Nara became Japan's first permanent capital, but only remained its capital for 74 years. During this period, the country witnessed the birth of Japan's arts, crafts, and literature, as Nara imported everything from religion to art and architecture from China. Return to Kyoto in the afternoon.

DAY 22: SUNDAY, JULY 13: KYOTO – TOKYO

Morning at leisure in Kyoto. Return to Tokyo in the afternoon by train and transfer on your own to the Youth Center.

DAYS 23-27: MONDAY - FRIDAY, JULY 14-18: TOKYO

Language instruction will be provided each day for four hours, 10:00am-12noon, and 1:00pm-3:00pm.

DAY 28: SATURDAY, JULY 19: TOKYO - HAKONE

Transfer on your own from the Youth Center to Tokyo rail station where you will use your provided rail pass to travel between Tokyo and Hakone. Upon arrival, enjoy a half-day sightseeing tour of this picturesque city, with a stop at the Mount Fuji Visitor Center and a cruise on Lake Ashi, with its magnificent views of Japan's most famous mountain.

Following the tour, transfer to your Hakone hotel for a one-night stay, with breakfast included. The remainder of the day is at leisure.

DAY 29: SUNDAY, JULY 20: HAKONE - TOKYO

Morning at leisure in Hakone. Return to Tokyo in the afternoon by train and transfer to Tokyo hotel for two-night stay.

DAY 30: MONDAY, JULY 21: TOKYO

Morning and afternoon at leisure prior to a festive farewell party, compliments of Yamano Japanese School, to celebrate the group's last night in Japan.

DAY 31: TUESDAY, JULY 22: TOKYO – LOS ANGELES

A motorcoach transfer will be provided from the Youth Center to Narita Airport for your return nonstop flight to Los Angeles, arriving the same day in the morning.

THE PROGRAM INCLUDES

- Round-trip air transportation from Los Angeles to Tokyo, on a regularly scheduled airline, such as United, economy class, "high season", weekend departure and weekend return.
- A total of 24 nights in dormitory accommodations, all with private bath/shower/toilet, at National Olympics Memorial Youth Center, based on single occupancy. Rooms have maid services, towels, televisions and computer lines.
- 5 Nights hotel accommodations, two nights each in Kyoto and Tokyo, one night in Hakone, based on share twin occupancy.
- 7 Day Japan Second Class Rail Pass.
- Toyko Half-Day Sightseeing Tour with private motorcoach and guide.
- Kyoto Half-Day Sightseeing Tour with private motorcoach and guide.
- Nara Half-Day Sightseeing Tour with private motorcoach and guide.
- Hakone Half-Day Sightseeing Tour with private motorcoach and guide.
- 5 breakfasts at hotel accommodations.
- Comprehensive Japanese language instruction through Yamano Japanese School, but held at the Youth Center.
- Round-trip Narita Airport/Youth Center transfers by private motorcoach.
- Access American Travel Protection Plan, Medical Insurance and Travel Protection Plan
- Service charges and taxes as related to hotels.

PROGRAM PRICE DOES NOT INCLUDE:
